Come one...Come all...to Each and Every One... an invitation to attend our informative monthly meetings. Enjoy strengthening and cultivating new friendships off the trails!


#### ADD THIS TO YOUR MARCH CALENDAR

#### WEDNESDAY WALKS IN A DAY GONE BY

There was a time when Ruth Cade and I used to drive to the Albany area, do two walks and return to Vermont the same day.

I remember very vividly one of those trips about seven years ago--Ron was still alive and Beryl Wolf was working in the area. Any way, one Wednesday we decided to do the Albany seasonal walk and do the evening walk with Ron. This was in the days when there was only one Wednesday walk a day--at 5 or 6 PM.

We left late, as usual, and ended getting to Albany pretty late and then had a great deal of trouble finding the start. We found the start and began the walk, only to be wet with a deluge from a terrible thunderstorm. We did not have time to stop, so we walked and got soaking wet. We still were running late to get our credit before the Visitors Center closed--they would not let us stamp our books before we started. I finally decided the only way we would get our books stamped was for me to take the books and run. I did get there, but I was a minute or two late. After a bit of begging, the staff stamped our books.

Then it was off to the evening walk. We were so late we did not take time to eat or find a bathroom. The walk was at Vischer's Ferry, which was at the end of the road, with no facilities. We arrived to find Beryl and Ron eating their home made sandwiches. They were sitting in their chairs totally relaxed and welcomed us, however, we were on the search for a bathroom and something to eat. They informed us there were not even any bathrooms at this location--they pointed to the woods. So off we went to fight off the mosquitoes in our soaking wet clothes to relieve ourselves.

In a short time, Ron set up a little table he carried to use for registering walkers, and the crowd grew to about twenty as we registered to walk. The mosquitoes were very thick, and we had no spray, but Ron shared his. Then it was time to walk. Not organized like it is today--Ron found that many of the places he had mapped out for the walk were flooded. Any way, we walked around mud puddles, through the mosquitoes for two hours.

About nine P M we climbed into our cars to drive home--we had a hungry, tired, and not completely dry for our two hour drive. But our days experiences were not over. There was a terrible thunder storm, which followed us most of the way home.

#### AMERICAN REVOLUTION WALKS

In January we began the final two years of the American Revolution Walks program. Since a number of you are still working on your first (or maybe your second) book, I've been asked where you can pick up some stamps this year.

To begin with, if you haven't done all of the qualified year rounds in this area, do these: Albany (10k only), Bennington, Cooperstown, Johnstown, Saratoga Battlefield, and Schenectady. A little farther away but still near the Capital District are Rhinebeck, Highland and West Point.

We have three Wednesday walks that qualify: Thacher Park, Cohoes and Waterford. And mark your calendars for our three traditional events with Revolution Walk credit: Fort Edward on April 14, Plattsburgh on August 11 and Schuylerville on October 17.

If you are heading to New England or Pennsylvania there are a number of YRE's in those areas. Check the Revolution Walks website for more information on these and walks in states further away. While the Starting Point often tells you what special event programs a walk qualifies for, there are qualified walks that aren't listed as such in that publication.

And remember, you have until December 31, 2008 to finish your book, so don't give up yet!

(If both husband and wife have different email address, please put both in the body with name.)
- IE: AOL can be either CAPS or small and it will go.

earthlink, yahoo, nycap.rr.com, etc. only small letters only work (NO CAPITALS AT ALL).

- 3. MOST IMPORTANT put walkescv@aol.com into your address book so that the mail won't be blocked as spam or junk mail. Many emails are returned because the your server does not recognize this mail.
- 4. IF you <u>change email addresses</u>, please notify Marie Klucina to update the records and keep you current and informed of our upcoming activities.
- 5. Lastly, if you are receiving the HOT MAILS and no longer wish to, put REMOVE in the subject and in the Body your Full Name and Email address that you wish to be removed.
