At a time when some other clubs are facing declining numbers we keep growing. I believe that a lot of that growth comes from the Wednesday walks. And for those who are already members, it offers an opportunity to get together with friends to chat, walk and, yes, eat, once a week. Fun, fitness and friendship and the fourth "F": food.

Although the Wednesday walks program ends next week, there are still lots of opportunities to get together with the resumption of our group walks of the YREs and seasonals beginning Sept. 2.

In his last column as president, Bernie Geren thanked a lot of people for all they did for ESCV. Modesty prevented him from mentioning his own contributions, so I'll remedy that omission: In addition to having served as President and Vice President, Bernie is the coordinator of the Wednesday walks program, prepares all our traditional walk brochures, has been the POC of numerous Wednesday and traditional events and has made his office space available as a much needed meeting site for various committees. #### **ESCV MEMBERS RECEIVE AVA AWARDS**

In conjunction with its biennial convention, AVA issues awards to members and clubs for their achievements. This year awards were presented both to individual members of ESCV and the club as a whole.

Our club was one of two in the nation to receive the President's Award. This award is made at the President's discretion based on criteria he selects. We were cited "for sustained achievement in serving their neighborhood with weekly traditional Volkssport walks. The Empire State Capital Volkssporters held 27 traditional events, mostly weekly guided walks-and they have done so for eighteen years."

In addition, the following members received individual awards:

The Meritorious Service Award was presented to Eileen Skinner and posthumously to Dave Skinner.

Eileen received her award "in recognition of her many years of service to the Empire State Capital Volkssporters in several roles, most notably for her decade of service as coordinator of the club's Wednesday walks program and as webmaster for the websites of ESCV and the Twin States Volkssport Association."

Dave's citation noted that "he served as club President and Vice President, delegate to a national convention and on many club committees. He developed and led numerous walks over his 17 years in the club. Always willing to help with any activity, he was truly "Mr. Volkswalking" to those who knew him."

Beryl Wolf was a posthumous recipient of the Distinguished Achievement Award. It was given "in recognition of her many years of service to the Empire State Capital Volkssporters, Patrick Pacers, and Southern Maine Volkssport Club. As a former Northeast Region Director, Beryl was involved as club representative to AVA conventions and as a year round event point of contact for many events in multiple states."

Barbara Kolapakka received the Certificate of Service Award for the American Revolution Walks special event program.

The box will be in the Cloak Room, straight ahead from the door on the right. This is a meeting facility & hotel for alumni & business people. Please be quiet upon entering as meetings may be in session in the Library or Lobby. Please thank the staff for letting us place our box there. We recommend you walk the short distance to the original start point which is temporarily closed. It is at 42nd Street between 5th and 6th Avenues. 1. As you exit the Williams Club doorway, turn LEFT on 39th St 2. Cross Madison & 5th Avenues 3. Turn right on 5th to 42nd Street. 4. The original start point store is on the right side of 42nd Street halfway down the block. The Village and Downtown walks require you taking the subway.
