A Bit from Barb.....

Saturday Feb. 12 we held our first ever snowshoe event at Christ the King Retreat Center in Greenwich. Forty-five people showed up to enjoy the snow (and hot beverages and cookies after). As POC, I had been worrying about this event for over a year since our snowfall was scant last year. However my prayers to the snow gods were answered (and how!) and we have more than enough snow to last for a while. I hope we don't have to turn our April walk at Clermont into a snowshoe! As always the folks at the Retreat Center extended their gracious hospitality and gave us a comfortable setting for the start point and socializing.

Doing a snowshoe walk as an AVA event is pretty rare. There are only four being done this year in the entire country and this was the only one east of Minnesota, so we had a chance to do a really different kind of event.

Despite the snow, we're also still walking on pavement. Group walks are coming up Feb. 20 in Troy and March 5 in Schenectady. Ellen McNett will once again host us for soup and chili at her house after the Schenectady walk. More information on the soup party is included in this newsletter.

Also included is a summary of our 2010 walk statistics. We had a total of 3,358 walkers from all our events. The YRE/seasonals had 457 more walkers last year than in 2009. Bus groups helped those statistics. I think the fact that groups want to come and do our walks is a testament to our having a number of interesting quality walks.

The Wednesday walk series saw a decline in numbers from 2009, most likely attributable to the hot, humid summer of 2010. The average attendance at the traditional weekend events was about the same, after adjusting for hosting one less walk last year than the year before.

Although we have a natural tendency to focus on our local club, we are part of a national organization that is now undergoing a self-examination to determine how it can best survive and grow in the future. A five year strategic plan is being developed which will be voted on by the National Executive Council in April. A first draft of that plan has been posted on the AVA website. (We have a link to it from our website.)

The draft is lengthy and not all of the recommendations in it directly affect the clubs, but it is important that you read at least those sections that would affect you as a member and your club. AVA has sent the draft to all members via the website and is soliciting comment from all of you. You should send any comments you have to Nicole Rogers, the Executive Director, with a copy to our North East Regional Director Patty Proulx.
