By the time you read this it will probably officially be spring although, at least up here in Saratoga, when I'm writing this, it sure doesn't look like it! Still a foot or more on the ground. And the flock of red-winged blackbirds that arrived last week must have been shocked to find that there was no open ground where they could forage for food. But they found my feeders so they're ok.

After all friendship is one of our three reasons for walking.

An interesting fact about our YRE/seasonals from our historian Dan Schryver: Did you know that Saratoga was the very first YRE for ESCV? It's now in its 21st year. The Albany capital walk and Schenectady came along a year later along with a walk in Bristol, RI (yes we use to have walks in Bristol and Sandwich, MA).

Since our last newsletter, there has been some turmoil in the national organization. At the February meeting of the AVA National Executive Council, a vote was taken on a motion to approve the hiring of the new executive director who had actually come on board in September. The motion was defeated and therefore her hiring was disapproved. As a consequence, President Curt Myron and Vice-president Wayne Holloway resigned their positions. There are now interim appointees in those positions. A statement from interim president Dennis Michele is included in this newsletter.

How these developments will affect AVA's development of a new strategic vision remains to be seen. However, day to day operations go on as usual with Candy Purcell, the finance officer, serving as acting executive director. And of course our club, one of the strongest in the country, goes on as well.

CANDIDATE FOR NORTHEAST REGIONAL DIRECTOR

In May we will be voting for the position of AVA Regional Director for the North East Region. The position has a two year term commencing after the AVA convention in June. There is a single candidate for this position, ESCV's own Doug Reynolds. Doug's biographical statement will be included in the upcoming Wanderer but some of you don't get that publication, so here it is:

DOUG REYNOLDS, Candidate, Northeast Regional Director

In 1997, a casual invitation to my wife, Jackie, and me from Joan Muir, our neighbor, was to join her on a Volks March. The word "march" did not conjure up an exciting day in the making, having spent two years in the Infantry, stationed at Forts Dix, Drum, and Devens, and also having taken 10 years to complete climbing the Adirondack 46 high peaks (#1805). "Do a what?" was my question. She provided a short history lesson about AVA, the local ESCV club (Empire State Capital Volkssporters), and details of the upcoming local walk at Peebles Island. This island is a Revolutionary War site we had never visited, even having lived in the Albany area for over a quarter century. We decided it might be something we could survive, once. Even after completing the whole 10 K under an umbrella, getting to meet a whole new group of folks who would become close friends, and to learn some history of our own back yard, it did turn out to be a very special day for us.

Over the next 13 years of my retirement from the NYS Education Department, we averaged over 40 events per year, mostly in our northern club, ESCV, and our southern club, Suncoast Sandpipers. They included completing 50 States/51 Capitals in eight years, as well as taking advantage of other AVA Special Events by finishing booklets for Presidential Sites; Civil War; Revolutionary War (2); and College/University (PhD, and Roads Scholar). We have done seven of the 10 Canadian Provincial Capitals, with three to go, plus Ottawa.

I was honored to receive an AVA 2005-2007 Biennial Award for Meritorious Service from Southeast Region for replicating ESCV's Wednesday Walk Program in Florida, that is called "Volks South", using the YREs of Suncoast Sandpipers, Meandering Manatees, Mid Florida Milers, and Florida Volkssport Association. Although I was recognized, it is an eight-year, team effort by many from the several clubs with whom I am privileged to cooperate. (The weekly January – April Wednesday walk schedule is available at web pages of both Suncoast Sandpipers and ESCV. All are welcome to join us when in Florida for any part of the winter season.)

At each Start Point, as an AVA Life Member, I am impressed how people I have never met, and might never meet, have designed walks that allow us to enjoy new regions. Directions to the Start, registration sheets, walk narrative/map, stamp, and insert cards are available according to AVA standards, the "glue" that holds this national initiative together. Accordingly, as part of my "payback," I have spent my time creating new walks, or modifying existing ones. I would take on the role of Northeast Regional Director as an additional contribution to AVA to help our association sustain its past contributions, and to assist in its future growth in the true spirit of fun, fitness, and friendship to the greatest benefit of all AVA members and new participants.

MESSAGE FROM AVA INTERIM PRESIDENT DENNIS MICHELE

The National Executive Council (NEC), in a closed session on Friday, February 18, 2011 exercised its right in accordance with the AVA Bylaws to approve the hiring of the AVA Executive Director. By a majority vote, the hiring was disapproved. As a result of the vote, the AVA President and AVA Vice President resigned. As this situation was not covered by the AVA Bylaws, the remaining members elected Dennis Michele, AVA Southeast Regional Director as Interim President until new elections are held at the upcoming AVA convention, June 2011. Marvin Stokes, AVA Treasurer, was elected Interim Vice President. Both men, as required by the AVA Bylaws, resigned from their previous respective positions on the NEC. Annette Tollett was elected as the Interim Treasurer to fill the vacant AVA Treasurers position. These actions were necessary to complete the NEC meeting and the business before it which had to be accomplished. From a personal stand point, it is regrettable that these matters had to be done, but it was necessary to keep the NEC and the AVA operating. I take no great pleasure in becoming the Interim President and will not seek election to this position at the upcoming elections at the AVA convention.
