#### **What Were Those Awards For?**

Several people recently asked me the question stated in the title of this article. This is written to provide ESCV members the answer to that question. Like almost all organizations, AVA has a policy manual which defines the structure of the organization as well as stating how procedures are to be followed. Among the topics in the policy manual are: General Policies, Membership, Volkssporting IVV Events and Recognition Awards.

Many of our ESCV members have received Recognition Awards over the years for their contributions to Volkswalking at the club, regional and national levels. This is one way to thank all the volunteers for their efforts to promote and carry out the Fun, Fitness and Friendship goals of Volkssporting. Here is a listing of the Recognition Awards that were taken from the AVA Policy Manual (only the main ones earned by club members are fully described here):

#### "A.AVA Hall of Fame Award

- B. AVA Distinguished Achievement Award
- C. AVA Meritorious Service Award: The AVA may bestow the AVA Meritorious Service Award upon individuals who have given at least five years of outstanding service to the AVA. The Meritorious Service Award will be awarded by the Regional Director of the region in which the majority of service was performed.
- D. Certificate of Service Award: The AVA may bestow the AVA Certificate of Service Award upon individuals who have given at least three years of significant service to the AVA. Certificate of Service Awards may be presented at three years, five years, and every five years thereafter. The Executive Council, appointed AVA officials and members of all national committees shall receive Certificate of Service Awards. National Committee Chairmen shall award Certificate of Service Awards to all members of national committees. All other Certificate of Service Awards shall be awarded by the Regional Director of the region in which the majority of service was performed.
- E. AVA President's Award: The AVA President may bestow the President's Award upon individuals, clubs or groups who, through their exemplary display of volkssporting spirit, are worthy of national recognition.
- F. Ted Ballman Memorial Award for Youth Volkssporters:
- G. AVA Trailblazer Award
- H. AVA Certificate of Appreciation Award: The AVA may bestow the AVA Certificate of Appreciation Award on individuals, organizations, and businesses for service to AVA on a national, regional, state or club level.
- I. IVV Honors"

Everyone is welcome to read AVA's policy manual by going to the AVA website – look for the Administrative Link in the blue bar at the top, drop down to General Administration and then go right to Publications and Policies. The policy manual is the fourth publication listed.


#### **Soup Kitchen Donation**

### This & <u>That – Oct 2013</u>

- 1. **Great Lakes Seaway Trails:** I'm sorry to report that our newest club in NE Region became "Inactive". This is **not** a result of the club's lack of activity, but was a decision of a new Executive Director of the sponsoring organization that wanted to go in a different direction. Fortunately, we have not lost the eight walks that had been created and sponsored by Seaway Trails. Barbara Stafford & Terry McFarland of Niagara Frontier club worked with the "Trails" past president, Daryl Giles, to ensure that those walks would continue to be available for the remainder of 2013 season, and all have been re-sanctioned for 2014. Daryl will be the POC for all eight walks. So, if you are in the area of Eastern Lake Ontario, please consider supporting their efforts by doing a walk(s) in: Ogdensburg, Cape Vincent, Sackets Harbor, Watertown, Fulton, Pultneyville, Oswego, & Sodus Pt. As with all walks in US, information is available at the AVA web site by following the sequence "www.ava.org"; "Events"; "Interactive Maps"; "YR/SE"; "Map Events"; "New York"; click on a pin & "Details".
- 2. Year Round/Seasonal Events (YR/SE) 2014 in NE Region: Please share with club members and potential members, the purpose of our clubs is to help ensure that persons will have sites for walking opportunities, not just from our club but those from across the country and internationally. As of this time, for 2014 our Region's clubs will offer 113 YR/SE walks (with the possibility of a few more being added) as compared to 111 for this current year. Nationally, there were 1,874 YR/SE walks listed in <a href="Starting Point 2013">Starting Point 2013</a>. The NE Region, being one of ten, our region's count should be about 187 walks, or on average about 19 walks per club. So, there is plenty of room for improvement. Interestingly, for 2013, we offered 47 YREs, and 64 SEs that had a total of 64 different Pts. of Contact who volunteered to manage the Walk Boxes. Thanks to all those folks who have gone the "extra mile" to help make our AVA/IVV process work. Please do not overlook due recognition at appropriate club gatherings for these individuals who work behind the scenes. A "tip-of-the-hat" to Walk'n Mass club that is currently sponsoring 20 YR/SE, and Twin State (with their satellite, Seacoast Striders) at 17 walks in this category. In addition, walk contributions were also made by: Finger Lakes (4); Twin Towns (5); Niagara Frontier (6); Connecticut Valley, Niagara Escarpment, Seaway Trails, & South Maine (8 each); West Point (12); & ESCV (15).

- 3. **Traditional Events (TEs) for 2014 in NE Region:** Sanctioning process for this category has started for next year but with a lot of planning for offerings still going on within the clubs. Some clubs are corresponding with other clubs to possibly coordinate a weekend event that presents a wonderful opportunity to encourage colleagues to come longer distances for a weekend of walks. Right now, the TEs' sanctioning cupboard is bare, but I'll try to get on them as soon as they start arriving via ESRs. This current year, NE Region offered 46 TEs, unfortunately, half of our clubs offered none. Although it usually takes a lot more logistics to conduct than YR/SE, the TEs are fantastic ways to build club enrollment as many more folks come together at one time for a walking experience, as compared to typically a couple persons doing a YR/SE walk together. Another "tip-of-the—hat to those clubs that have TEs in 2013: Twin State (2); Finger Lakes (5); West Point, & Walk'n Mass (7 each); & ESCV (25).
- 4. **Traditional Events' Formats:** It is a lot of additional work to conduct a "traditional", Traditional Event. Although it is a nice experience for those who attend, some club leaders report that it is becoming too much work, especially as club leaders become older, when it is difficult to find volunteers to do the tasks (registration table, mark the trail, check point(s), water bottles/canisters, walk direction/map for all, etc.). However, IVV/AVA rules do allow for a second style of TE that clubs should consider. Take a look at the <u>Policy Manual</u> at the AVA web site (www.ava.org; "Administrative"; "General Admin"; "Publication/Policy"; & click on <u>AVA Policy Manual</u>). Go to Section 4, Part 4.02 "Traditional Volkssporting IVV Events", Policy II, # 2 **Guided Walking Events**. This section lays out how to conduct this format where "...one or more designated guides familiar with the predetermined route..." can lead the group(s) without the need for each person having maps, marked trail, etc. It is a cost-effective way to provide many more opportunities for monthly and weekly group walking experiences. Some clubs attribute their success in attracting new members was by increasing the frequency of gatherings, and having the whole group together to enjoy the fellowship of others, and of course going off together for breakfast or lunch following the walk. When getting new members, quickly getting them involved in club tasks makes them feel an integral part of meeting the organization's mission of providing walks in your area. This "guided" format could be a technique that may well rejuvenate interest in your club's total activities.
- 5. Consider Special TE Walk Dates in 2014: "World Walk Day", traditionally conducted on May 8<sup>th</sup> that has been falling midweek, for this coming year will be celebrated on Sat., May 10<sup>th</sup>. For the past event there was a special AVA book stamp provided to club's that participated by offering an event. I have not yet gotten word as to what will be provided in 2014, but consider this date as an opportunity to be involved in a worldwide walk. Also, October is National Volkssport Month where a single, or series of events could be hosted by your club. Start the planning process now for some walks. Within the month, maybe a series of walks in your area that would feature different settlements such as rural, small village, & big city; or settlements of oldest historical site, late 1800s-early 1900s site, & modern settlement; or ocean front, river, lake, etc. I assume that again a unique patch will be available for those participating. This is not an exhaustive list; let your imagination run wild.
- 6. AVA Special Programs & Club Challenges: Besides continuing several national Special Programs, there will be nine new ones available on Jan 1, 2014. One of the new offerings is sponsored by our own Finger Lakes club, "Trekking With the Trees". They are currently leading the national Special Program "America's Baseball Walks" that ends Dec 31, 2014. The Twin State club is the national sponsors for "Classic American Diners" that also concludes on Dec 31, 2014. A special thanks to these two clubs for taking on these national incentive programs. Information on any of the Sp. Programs can be found at the AVA web site under "Events". Although running a national Special Programs may beyond the resources on your club, consider running a "Club Challenge" for your members as an additional way to engage your members, or potential members. We have several running in the Region presently. For information on approval of your local challenge so you would be authorized to use the AVA & IVV logos, plus the stamp, take a look at the AVA Policy Manual, Section 4, Paragraph 4.05 C.
- 7. Advertising Your Events: I've been very impressed as to how much effort clubs puts into preparing for, and conducting a TE. However, I've been concerned that we are selling ourselves short by not making more folks in the community where the event will occur informed that "Volkssporting is in town". That is not to say that I have not recognized that sponsoring clubs have contacted sister clubs within the Region about an upcoming event in hopes that they will attend. My concern is that, in too many cases, we have not done and adequate job of spreading the word of the event's opportunity outside of the Volkssport circle. Often, the reason for this is clear; there are so few club members trying to just conduct the event that there is no one left to take on the task of publicity. But, without attracting new members to our sport, how will we ever be able to find folks to expand our ranks and help share these

other important tasks? Local media are usually more than happy to help spread the word, as they are looking for material to communicate local events. Some communities have a single contact person who will share news items systematically to multiple outlets, all for free. Also, don't forget the potential of the AVA "New Walker Packet" that, hopefully, will have been augmented with your own club's materials, such as upcoming events' dates & locations. This resource is a wonderful way to get "outsiders" into the circle of your Volks community.

- 8. **Rating Walks:** Many thanks to those responsible for rating your club's walks. During sanctioning, I have noted improvement in giving a more accurate description of the change in Incline and Terrain via using the new "number & letter" grading system. When the new rating system was introduced officially for 2013, there was a tendency by many to keep the number and letter low (much like in the old method of a 1+ rather than 2; or a 2 rather than 2+) so as not to discourage folks for doing the walk. Only occasionally now have I had to question a discrepancy in the rating and the "walk description". Please do not shy away from a rating of 3C if the route fits the narrative that can be found in the <u>Trainmaster Guide</u> available at the AVA web site. We have found the Cumulative Elevation rating is not as valuable for assessing the trail as the narrative comparative information. Let us all be sure not to underrate a walk for a goal of increasing participation as we must be sure that our walking colleagues are alerted to what lays ahead. It is a big safety issue that we must all honor.
- 9. **AVA Council Meeting Fall 2014:** Your current AVA President, Dennis Michele, wants to return to the practice of having the National Executive Council meetings in various locations in the country during club activities rather than all of them in Universal City, TX, home of headquarters. This practice has provided an opportunity for club members to see the Council in action but, more importantly, to let the Council members see other clubs in action. It is a wonderful method for educating both parties. The Council has elected to visit the Albany area for its weekend of Oct 18, 2014 meeting that would coincide with ESCV's Oktoberfest. A general invitation will be extended to the clubs of the NE Region for both attending Council meetings that Thursday evening, all day Friday, and Sat afternoon. An Oktoberfest walk and lunch will be scheduled for that Saturday morning and noon, plus a guided Albany Capital Walk on Sunday. I'll share additional information with the clubs as plans are finalized.
